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

# TITAN SHOPPE



- Staffed by high school students, who learn a valuable set of employment skills.
- Teaches time management & multitasking skills.
- Students brew coffee and prepare food items, while also gaining a fundamental understanding of operating a business through inventory management, handling cash, and basic financial transactions.

## TITAN LAUNDROMAT



- Equipped with commercial grade appliances and accessories
- Provides work-based learning experiences, while also teaching independent living skills.



# TITAN INDEPENDENT LIVING LAB



- Features a kitchen, living room, dining room, and bedroom simulations.
- Students engage in hands-on activities such as cooking and cleaning, as well as developing social and employment skills.
- Students gain necessary daily skills needed to live independently or as a contributing member of their family and community.





- Provides soft lighting, furniture, and materials.
- Fosters a comforting environment for students when they are feeling overwhelmed academically or socially.
- Staffed by Family Behavioral Resources, these professionals work closely with students to help them access and alleviate their feelings.

# **CALMING CORNER**



- Equipped with sensory tools, such as lights, fidgets, and special seating.
- Allows students to take a break in order to refocus.

# **COOL ZONE**



- Provides a safe space for children who exhibit symptoms or who currently have a behavioral health diagnosis.
- Open year round including the summer.

### **ON-SITE VOCATIONAL PROGRAMMING**

- Weekly on-site OVR (Office of Vocational Rehabilitation) representative conducts comprehensive assessments of individual strengths, interests, abilities, and aptitudes.
- Develops and implements individualized employment strategies.
- Provides career counseling and training.
- Delivers job placement services.

#### TRANSITION COORDINATOR

- Assists students with transitioning from student life to adulthood.
- Works with school staff to determine a student's functional needs within the school and community settings.
- Develops an appropriate transition plan.
- Provides students with information on available resources, employment opportunities, and programs.

#### **ON-SITE COUNSELORS**

• The district employs a group of caring, well-trained counselors. Currently, the district has one on-site counselor at each elementary school, two counselors at the middle school and three at the high school.

#### TITAN TROOP

- Inclusive club that integrates all students regardless of skills and abilities.
- Promotes inclusive practices within the school district and community.
- Students meet with other, similar high school clubs in the multi-county area, as part of the STARS (Schools Together with Athletes Reaching Success) program.

#### TITAN PARTNER PROGRAM

- Supports students with higher academic, social, or emotional needs.
- Partners students with peers to help them thrive within elective classes.
- Offers social support and facilitates individual student needs through programs presented by teachers.
- Creates a strong school community and fosters inclusivity.

#### **FAMILY ENGAGEMENT OPPORTUNITIES**

 The district makes a strong effort to engage with and develop strong relationships with its students' families through learning, special events, and individualized meetings.

- Helps educators teach students the fundamentals of emotional regulation, conversational dynamics, and other social skills.

## **COMMUNITY-BASED INSTRUCTION**

- Teaches students hands-on, daily living activities and/or employment skills.
