### Education Stability Team (CYF)

This team partners with school staff when children enter foster or move their residence while placement with CYF. They include school staff in Best Interest Decision meetings to decide where children & youth *in care* will attend school and they troubleshoot transportation needs. School staff should connect with them before enrolling or withdrawing a student who is placed in care by CYF.
