2. School-Counseling Department Mission Statement

The West Mifflin Area School District School Counseling Department identifies annual SMART goals and objectives at each grade level band in the academic, career and social emotional domains. Data on each of these goals is collected, analyzed and shared with the advisory council at the annual meeting. These goals are designed to be specific, measurable, achievable, realistic and result focused. The timeline for the goals is clearly identified.

West Mifflin Area School District maintains a career guidance service action planning document describing the benefits and contributions of each stakeholder group in relation to the delivery of guidance services. The stakeholder groups are comprised of:

5. Role of the School Counselor:

The school counselor's role is to encourage personal responsibility in students as they work toward becoming successful citizens in an ever-changing global society.

6. Advisory Council: See 339.32(9)

The advisory council is a representative group of stakeholders selected to review and advise on the implementation of the school counseling program. The advisory council will assist school counselors by advising on program goals; reviewing program results; making recommendations about the school counseling program; advocating and engaging in public relations for the school counseling program; advocating for funding and resources.

Annual advisory meetings are held in the spring of each year and members are periodically reviewed to maintain active participation and representation of each stakeholder group. Council members and meeting minutes are maintained by the lead counselor (guidance department head).

7. Monthly Guidance Service Calendars: See 339.32(1)

Monthly calendars are separated by grade level bands as well as academic, career and social emotional learning (SEL). Calendars are annually reviewed and updated by school counselors at each grade level.

8. Four-Tiered Delivery System: See 339.32(7)

The WMASD counseling department maintains a four-tiered delivery system organized by grade level that includes curriculum, prevention, intervention and responsive services, individual student planning and system support across each grade band including both formal and informal career consultations with teachers, counselors and administrators

9. Organizing Career /Postsecondary Resources See 339.32(3)

The West Mifflin School Counseling Department maintains a list of diverse external resources organized by the national career clusters to be utilized for topics such as career readiness, work-based learning experiences and postsecondary and technical training options.

10. Individualized Academic/Career Plan See 339.32(2)

Starting in 5th grade students will develop their Academic/Career Plan. This plan will serve as the graduation project requirement, and will be completed by the student throughout high school with the foundation beginning at the 5th grade level. Naviance by PowerSchool will be the electronic career platform utilized to store the career evidence and individualized plans. Each West Mifflin Area High School graduate must present a senior project as a requirement of the 12th grade English curriculum. This project is a cumulative presentation of research and career preparation beginning with the 5th grade academic/career plan.

11. Career and Technical Center Strategy See 339.32(5)

West Mifflin Area School District in collaboration with Steel Center AVTS provides a variety of activities focused on CTE awareness targeted at students, parents and educators.

12. Career Placement and Transition Services See 339.32(6)

West Mifflin Area High School provides career guidance services to all students that include provisions for the placement and transition from school to postsecondary work, college and the military.

13. Follow up Studies See 339.32 (10)

Follow up studies to determine the effectiveness of the career guidance services have not previously been conducted by the West Mifflin Area School District. Beginning with the Class of 2023 West Mifflin Area School District will begin utilizing Naviance by PowerSchool to collect data to be utilized to improve career guidance services.
